### RIDDOR – Covid-19

There is no requirement under RIDDOR (The Reporting of Injuries, Diseases and Dangerous Occurrences Regulations 2013) to report incidents of disease or deaths of members of the public, patients, care home residents or service users from COVID-19.

You should only make a report under RIDDOR when one of the following applies:

- An accident or incident at work has, or could have, led to the release or escape of coronavirus (SARS-CoV-2). This must be reported as [a dangerous occurrence](#)
- A person at work (a worker) has been diagnosed as having COVID-19 attributed to an occupational exposure to coronavirus. This must be reported as [a case of disease](#)
- A worker dies as a result of occupational exposure to coronavirus. This must be reported as [a work-related death due to exposure to a biological agent](#)

## Pat Testing

### What is PAT Testing?

Portable Appliance Testing or PAT Testing involves carrying out safety checks on portable electrical appliances via a series of visual inspections and electronic tests.

### PAT Testing requirements

UK Regulations state that business's must ensure that electrical equipment is maintained to a safe condition.

### Who can carry out PAT Testing?

Any electrical work should be carried out by a suitably qualified and competent person. Our team at Fleet Health & Safety are City & Guilds qualified to carry out PAT Testing.

### What does PAT Testing involve?

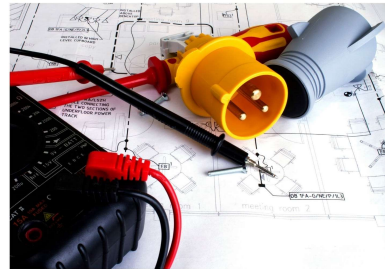
The process involves visual checks on the appliance, plug and lead. For class 1 equipment, a more indepth test is carried out.

### What will I receive?

An inventory of all items tested and their results. A list of any failed items and reasons for failing. A pass/fail label on each appliance which contains date tested, next due date and signature of person testing.

## PAT Testing during COVID

- ✚ We can only carry out PAT Testing once lockdown restrictions are eased.
- ✚ All equipment should be collated into one main area where possible and a list should be provided by email beforehand of equipment to be tested and its location.
- ✚ All equipment should be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected before we arrive. This is so that we are in your premises for as little time as possible.
- ✚ Premises should have minimal or no other individuals on the day the testing is to take place. Any individuals that are on the premises should stay within 2 metres of ourselves and wear masks at all times.
- ✚ Hand sanitiser should be provided.
- ✚ All items and surfaces touched or handled during testing will be thoroughly cleaned after testing
- ✚ You must have a Covid Risk Assessment in place
